WINTER DRIVING SAFETY IN THE PACIFIC NORTHWEST

It's the time of year for drivers to increase driving safety during wet and cold weather. Above all, it is important to:

- Check road conditions: visit www.tripcheck.com or call (800) 977-6368.
- SLOW DOWN, especially in high water.
- Keep your mind on the primary task of driving.
- Keep windshield wipers clean and in good working condition.
- Maintain a safe distance from vehicles in front of you; 3-4 times as usual in wet weather.
- Avoid the use of cruise control in wet weather.
- Turn on your headlights for visibility.
- Carry chains and follow Oregon's chain laws.
- Keep your gas tank at least half-full.
- ALWAYS designate a sober driver for transportation.

Be sure to buckle up and be safe as you enjoy the winter wonders around us!



MADISON HIGH SCHOOL **MODERNIZATION**



Madison High School is one of four schools scheduled to be modernized with the \$790 million Portland Public Schools Bond approved in May 2017. Madison parent, teacher, student, and community stakeholders, as well as the public, have been involved with development of the design for the Madison High School campus. Construction is scheduled to start during the summer break of 2019, and continue until the summer break of 2022. Madison High students will attend classes at Marshall High School while construction is being completed, and return to the modernized Madison campus for the 2022-2023 school year. This past season, Portland Bureau of Transportation conducted a pilot project for National Night Out Block Parties in the neighborhoods east of 82nd and in all of Cully. By translating documents, eliminating permit fees, and offering free use barricades they had four times as many participants in 2017. One family in Cully neighborhood had never seen or met some of their neighbors, despite having lived on their street for 14 years, noting that they would surely host again. Fantastic success!

Passenger vehicles are required to display 2 license plates in the state of Oregon. One must be displayed on the front of the vehicle, and the other on the rear.
