PORTLAND PARKS AND RECREATION SUMMER FREE FOR ALL

Summer Free For All encourages the creation and cultivation of community by providing free, accessible, family-friendly summer activities that celebrate Portland's wonderful cultural diversity. <u>Free lunch and play:</u> Supporting families by offering nutritious meals and recreational activities during the summer recess. June 20 to August 25, Monday through Friday, Montavilla Park, 8219 NE Glisan Street. Free lunch at noon, and sports, games, and arts and crafts from 11 am until 4 pm.

<u>Free Open Play Swimming:</u> No registration required, just drop in and have a splash! June 20 to August 25, Tuesdays 1:00-2:30 pm, Montavilla Park, 8219 NE Glisan Street.

EAST PORTLAND INVOLVED CITIZENS

We missed you at the May EPIC meeting. *Lieutenant Jason Pearce* spoke about the busy summer season ahead, with increased gang activity predicted. He also mentioned the challenges of keeping Rose Festival activities safe in view of the many protests in the city.

Officer Mike Gallagher gave an informative keynote address about sex trafficking in Portland. He explained how the activities are less visible these days; rather than seeing prostitutes on major boulevards, social media is now being used to meet their customers. Officer Gallagher emphasized that most of the girls and women who sell themselves are controlled by pimps; they nearly always suffer from low self-esteem, have been sexual victims, are "looking for love", are often runaways, and have been sold the "dream" from their pimps. The **Sex Trafficking Unit** focuses on helping women leave the "life" by providing them protection, immediate resources, and connecting them with social service agencies. The law enforcement aspect of the unit is to convict the traffickers. Although it is time consuming and difficult, the unit has helped convict pimps who have been sentenced to long prison terms, including life. Officer Gallagher's presentation was enlightening for everyone in the room.

Commander Brian Parman ended the meeting with a question and answer session. Community members were able to express their concerns, especially about the homeless situation in Portland and the abandoned vehicle problem visible in their neighborhoods. Our next meeting will be on July26, 2017. Our keynote address will be the <u>Rapid Response Team</u>. Bring a neighbor and join us from 6 to 8 pm at the East Precinct Community Room, 737 SE 106th Ave, Portland. Dave Smith



Oregon Air National Guard is expanding use of a special landing procedure at Portland International Airport during a six month trial period from May 1 to October 31, 2017. Procedures will be flown sunrise to sunset daily, and both the east and west ends of both primary runways are being used (though 65% of all landings will still be performed where they have been performed since 2008). 
