PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19

The Oregon Health Authority is responding to an outbreak of respiratory illness, called COVID-19, caused by a novel (new) coronavirus. Health officials are urging strict social distancing, diligent and thorough good hand hygiene, covering all coughs, and staying home if you are sick.

Steps you can take to prevent spread of flu and the common cold will also help prevent coronavirus: • Wash hands often with soap and water. If not available, use an alcoholbased hand sanitizer • Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands • Avoid close contact with people who are sick • Stay home while you are sick and avoid close contact with others • Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw it away. If you don't have a tissue, cough into your elbow. • Clean and disinfect objects and surfaces that you frequently touch.

Si usted sigue los pasos para evitar la propagación de la gripe común, también ayudará a prevenir el coronavirus: • Lávese las manos con frecuencia con agua y jabón. Si eso no es posible, use un desinfectante de manos a base de alcohol. • Evite tocarse los ojos, la nariz o la boca con las manos sin lavar. • Evite el contacto estrecho con personas enfermas. • Quédese en su casa si está enfermo y evite el contacto estrecho con otras personas. • Cúbrase al toser o estornudar con un pañuelo, y luego tírelo. Si no tiene un pañuelo, tosa en el codo. • Limpie y desinfecte objetos y superficies que sean tocados a menudo.

Nếu quý vị không có khăn giấy, hãy ho vào khuỷu tay áo. • Vệ sinh và khử trùng đồ vật và bề mặt quý vị thường chạm vào.

Take a Walk on the Wild Side

Contributed By Suzanne Briggs Come discover one of our neighborhood's hidden treasures - the Rose City Bluff Trail. Hidden along the north edge of the Rose City Golf Course, below NE Sacramento St., it is a half-mile long nature trail. Since March 2018, a group of area residents have been working to reclaim this bluff from invasive brambles overly successful non-native blackberries in order to expose and encourage native plants; and to encourage its use as a walking trail. Trail patrons often pause to express their appreciation created many which has friendships. The Rose City Bluff weekly email now connects over 50 trail advocates. Two years later, the hillside is now transformed with expanded views and uncovered precious native plants. In February, we began planting more native species of plants donated by volunteers and our neighbor, Greg Shepherd,

The Rose City Bluff is constantly changing with the seasons, so more Native Plant Walks will be scheduled in the future. Each decade, the census provides an opportunity to count every person living in the U.S.

The data collected has an impact:

- REPRESENTATION: Determines the number of seats each state receives in the U.S. House of Representatives.
- FUNDING: Informs how billions of dollars are distributed for critical public services including: roads, schools, and hospitals.

April 1, 2020 is national Census Day. By this date, every home will receive an invitation to participate. Once the invite arrives, you can respond online, by phone, or mail. Get involved and shape the future of your community.

Chief Resch was appointed to the Portland Police Bureau in February 1999, serving as a Patrol Officer, Neighborhood Response Team Officer, and Tactical Operations Division Crime Analyst Officer. She was promoted to Sergeant in 2008, promoted to Lieutenant in 2012, promoted to Captain in 2016, served as Acting Commander, was appointed Assistant Chief of the Investigations Branch in 2018, and most recently served as Deputy Chief. Chief Resch has served as the manager of the Portland Police Honor Guard and as a Critical Incident Commander, and has been an active member in the Police Bureau's Muslim Council, Slavic Advisory Council, and Refugee Integration Program. She enjoys volunteering her time to Camp Rosenbaum, Shop with a Cop, and as a mentor for the Zman Scholarship Foundation. MAY 2020 PRIMARY ELECTION

On May 19, 2020, the Democratic and Republican parties in Oregon will be holding a Closed Primary (In order to vote for partisan office candidate (President/VP, US Senate, US Representative, State Legislature, Secretary of State, Treasurer, and Attorney General), you must be registered with either the Democratic or Republican party by the voter registration and party change deadline, April 28, 2020. Voters who are registered non-affiliated or with a minor party will receive a ballot including ballot measures and non-partisan office candidates (County and City Commissioners, Judges, and Metro Councilors). Register to vote, update your party affiliation, and more at: https://sos.oregon.gov/voting-elections.
